


Mission:

Healthcare and Disability Facts

- US spends more on healthcare than any other country
- US has the highest rate of infant deaths and preventable deaths
- Most healthcare spending in the US is spent on pharmaceuticals
- Health First Colorado and CHIP covers 58.8% of children
- A pediatrician treating a child enrolled in Medicaid only receives 66% of what is "reimbursable"
- In the last 5 years, 21% increase in behavior problems for children in US aged 3-17
- 1 in 36 8-year-old children identified with ASD in 2020
- 1/3 of 8 year old children with ASD also have intellectual disability
- 40% of children and adolescents with ASD have co-occurring anxiety disorders
- People with Intellectual Disability are 4x more likely to experience developmental trauma
- Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome is 10x higher in the San Luis Valley than the rest of Colorado





Fee-for-Service vs Value-Based Healthcare

Fee-for-Service

- Providers are reimbursed for each service rendered based on a fee schedule
- Leads to over-utilization of services, higher healthcare costs, administrative burdens and lack of coordination
- Potential for higher out-of-pocket costs

Value-Based Healthcare Model

- Emphasizes high-quality, improved patient outcomes, care coordination, and population health management
- Reduces unnecessary services and healthcare costs
- Providers are reimbursed based on quality and outcomes, with financial incentives tied to achieving positive results
- simplified claims process, shared risk and collaboration among providers, and evaluation through quality measures such as vaccination rates and screenings

Understanding and Implementing a Value-Based Healthcare Model

A healthcare payment model that rewards improved health outcomes and quality performance instead of the volume of services provided

Value-based healthcare prioritizes...

Capability - the ability of patients to do the things that define them as individuals and enable them to be themselves

Comfort - *relief* from physical and emotional suffering

Calm - ability to live *normally* while getting care

Value-based healthcare creates...

Intrinsic motivation for clinicians to connect to their purpose as healers and allows creative problem solving for to reduce caregiver *burnout* and high employee turnover in healthcare

Value-based healthcare rewards...

Success based on effectiveness, efficiency, patient values, safety, cost and equity through outcome measures developed by the healthcare provider and the state
